21-Day Devotional: Room for More

Welcome to this 21-day journey of prayer and fasting. As we embark on our "Room for More" generosity campaign, we believe that more is possible through God. This campaign isn't just about a building; it's about making space for more of God's presence, more lost people to be found, and more found people to grow.

Over the next 21 days, we will align our hearts with God's will, surrender our own plans, and seek His vision for our church family and community. Let's start with a posture of humility and expectation, believing that God will do immeasurably more than we can ask or imagine.

The Biblical Purpose of Our Fasting and Prayer

Fasting isn't about manipulating God to get what we want; it's about denying ourselves so we can better hear His voice and align our desires with His. When we fast, we are saying that our hunger for God is greater than our hunger for food, entertainment, or anything else we give up. It's a way of intentionally setting aside our physical needs to focus on our spiritual needs.

The biblical purpose of fasting is to humble ourselves before God. It shows God that we are serious about seeking Him and His will. It's our personal way of saying, "Your kingdom is more important to me than my own comforts."

Part 1: A Heart Prepared (Days 1-7)

Day 1: A Vision from God

Scripture: “Where there is no vision, the people perish.” - Proverbs 29:18

Reflection: Before we can have a vision for a physical space, we must first have a vision from God for His spiritual kingdom. A vision isn't just a goal; it's a picture of a preferred future God reveals to us. It starts with seeing people as He sees them—lost and in need of a Savior. Let's pray that God would make His vision so clear to us that we can't help but be obedient.

Prayer Focus:

Pray for a unified, clear vision for our church and campaign.

Ask God to place a burden on your heart for the people He wants to reach.

Pray that our vision would be centered on Jesus.

Action: Write down what you believe God's vision is for your church on a small card and place it somewhere you will see it every day.

Day 2: The God of All Provision

Scripture: “And my God will meet all your needs according to the riches of his glory in Christ Jesus.” - Philippians 4:19

Reflection: Often our biggest obstacle in a campaign is not a lack of resources, but a lack of faith. God is not limited by our bank accounts or our giving habits. He is the owner of everything and our provider. The goal of this campaign is not to raise money, but to glorify God by trusting in His ability to provide abundantly.

Prayer Focus:

Pray for an increase of faith in your own heart and the heart of our church.

Thank God for His past provision and trust Him for the future.

Pray against any spirit of fear or doubt concerning finances.

Action: Make a note of a time when God provided for you in a miraculous way and thank Him for it.

Day 3: Faith Over Fear

Scripture: “For the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives us power, love and self-discipline.” - 2 Timothy 1:7

Reflection: The enemy’s first tactic is to whisper fear and impossibility into our ears. He wants us to believe that this vision is too big, that the challenges are too great, and that we will surely fail. But God has given us a spirit of power, not fear. We stand on the truth that with God, all things are possible. Our faith is not in our own abilities but in His.

Prayer Focus:

Pray that you would have the courage to step out in faith.

Pray against any lies of fear or doubt in your mind.

Pray for a spirit of boldness to be released in our church.

Action: Identify one specific fear you have about the campaign and release it to God in prayer.

Day 4: Unity in the Body

Scripture: “Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace.” - Ephesians 4:3

Reflection: There is power in a unified church. The enemy loves to create division, but Jesus prayed that we would be one. When we are unified in purpose and vision, we can overcome any obstacle. Our unity is a testimony to the world of Christ's love. Let's commit to protecting the unity of our church during this campaign.

Prayer Focus:

Pray for unity among the church leadership, staff, and volunteers.

Pray for a spirit of peace and humility to permeate our church family.

Pray that any potential disagreements would be handled with grace and love.

Action: Reach out to a church member you don't know well and encourage them.

Day 5: Generous Hearts

Scripture: “Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.” - 2 Corinthians 9:7

Reflection: Giving is an act of worship. It's an opportunity to respond to God's generosity with our own. True giving comes from a heart full of gratitude and cheerfulness, not from a sense of obligation. During this campaign, let's ask God to transform our hearts into ones of joyful generosity, trusting that He will provide for our needs as we give.

Prayer Focus:

Pray for a cheerful and generous heart.

Ask God to show you what He would have you give.

Pray for the financial breakthrough of anyone facing a challenge.

Action: Take a moment to thank God for everything He has given you.

Day 6: The Power of Surrender

Scripture: “Is not this the kind of fasting I have chosen: to lose the chains of injustice and untie the cords of the yoke?” - Isaiah 58:6

Reflection: As we deny ourselves, our physical hunger reminds us of our deeper spiritual hunger for God. This daily act of self-discipline is an act of surrender. It is a powerful way to put God's will and purpose for this campaign before our own desires. By surrendering control of our bodies, we learn to surrender control of our lives, our finances, and our future to Him.

Prayer Focus:

Pray for the discipline to stick with your fast.

Ask God to show you any areas of your life where you have not fully surrendered to Him.

Pray that our corporate fast would be a powerful act of surrender to God's will.

Action: Reflect on what you are fasting from and why.

Day 7: The God of Breakthrough

Scripture: "Then the angel of the Lord came and sat under the oak in Ophrah... The Lord is with you, mighty warrior." - Judges 6:11-12

Reflection: Gideon was a weak man, hiding from his enemies, yet God called him a "mighty warrior." God sees us not as we are, but as we are destined to be in Him. As we finish our first week, remember that God sees our hearts and our obedience. He is the God of breakthrough, and He is with us. Trust Him to break down walls and bring about His will.

Prayer Focus:

Pray for a breakthrough in your personal life.

Ask God to break down any spiritual barriers hindering our campaign.

Pray for the impossible to become possible.

Action: Re-read the vision you wrote down on Day 1 and ask God to reaffirm it in your heart.

Part 2: The Vision Unfolds (Days 8-14)

Day 8: More Lost People to Be Found

Scripture: “For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost.” - Luke 19:10

Reflection: Jesus’ entire ministry was focused on finding the lost. Our campaign isn’t about building a kingdom for ourselves but about extending the kingdom of God by reaching those who do not know Him. This vision starts with a genuine love and compassion for the lost.

Prayer Focus:

Pray for a heart that breaks for the lost.

Pray for the lost in our community, city, and world.

Pray for the right people to be drawn to our church and to this new building.

Action: Think of three people you know who are far from God and commit to praying for them by name this week.

Day 9: More Found People to Grow

Scripture: “Like newborn babies, crave pure spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow up in your salvation.” - 1 Peter 2:2

Reflection: The mission doesn't stop once a person accepts Christ. A new building will allow us to create a space where new believers can grow in their faith through discipleship, community, and service. The vision is to grow in maturity in Christ.

Prayer Focus:

Pray for the new believers that will come to our church.

Pray for our leaders and volunteers as they prepare to disciple new people.

Pray for a hunger for God's Word and deeper relationships to be a cornerstone of our church.

Action: Write down one area of your spiritual life where you want to grow.

Day 10: The Harvest is Plentiful

Scripture: “He told them, ‘The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field.’” - Luke 10:2

Reflection: A new building is a tool, but the real work is done by the people. We need to be a church filled with passionate workers who are ready to go into the harvest field. As we build a new space, we must also ask God to send us more people who are ready to serve and share the Gospel.

Prayer Focus:

Pray for a heart to serve the Lord and His people.

Pray for God to raise up more leaders and volunteers.

Pray that you would be ready to say "yes" to whatever God calls you to do.

Action: Find one way to serve in at Remade and commit to serving this week.

Day 11: Breaking the Barriers

Scripture: “And I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven; whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven.”
- Matthew 16:19

Reflection: We are in a spiritual battle, and we have the authority to speak life and break spiritual barriers. As we pray and fast, we can declare victory over any opposition to our campaign. We have the keys to the kingdom, and we can use them to bind the forces of evil and loose the blessings of God over our campaign.

Prayer Focus:

Pray against any spiritual opposition or attack against our church.

Declare God’s favor and blessing over our campaign.

Pray for any personal barriers you are facing to be broken.

Action: Take a moment to walk and pray, speaking life over the people in your life.

Day 12: The Power of Community

Scripture: “And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds.” - Hebrews 10:24

Reflection: Our faith is not meant to be lived in isolation. We need each other. A new building gives us the opportunity to create a space that fosters deeper community, relationships, and a sense of belonging. Let’s remember that the campaign is about building community and relationships, not just a building.

Prayer Focus:

Pray for a spirit of community in our church.

Pray for new friendships and relationships to be formed.

Pray for every person to feel a sense of belonging.

Action: Intentionally sit with someone you don't know at church this week and introduce yourself.

Day 13: The Miracle of Generosity

Scripture: “And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work.” - 2 Corinthians 9:8

Reflection: When we give, we are not just giving away money, we are planting seeds of faith. God promises to bless us in return so that we can do even more good work. Our generosity is a miracle. It is a tangible way to put our faith into action. Let's pray for the miracle of generosity to be released in our hearts and in our church family.

Prayer Focus:

Pray that God would multiply our offerings.

Pray for the ability to give cheerfully.

Pray that our giving would be a testimony of God's faithfulness.

Action: Find a way to practice generosity in a small way today.

Day 14: Rest in His Faithfulness

Scripture: “The Lord is faithful to all his promises and loving toward all he has made.” - Psalm 145:13

Reflection: The middle of a campaign can be tiring. We might feel like we are running on empty. But as we finish our second week, let's take a moment to rest in the faithfulness of God. He is not a man that He should lie. He is faithful to His promises. He has brought us this far, and He will finish what He started.

Prayer Focus:

Pray that you would find rest and peace in God.

Pray for our leaders and volunteers to be refreshed.

Pray for our church to be a place of peace and rest.

Action: Take a few moments to do something restful that honors God.

Part 3: Into the Harvest (Days 15-21)

Day 15: Reaching Our City

Scripture: “You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden.” - Matthew 5:14

Reflection: A new building will serve as a lighthouse in our city. It will be a place where people can come and encounter the love of Jesus. We are called to be a light to the world, and this new space will allow us to be even more visible. Let’s pray that our church would be a shining example of God's love to our community.

Prayer Focus:

Pray for the people in our city who don't know Jesus.

Pray that our church would be a beacon of hope in our community.

Pray for God to give us divine opportunities to share the Gospel.

Action: Spend time today praying for the future location and the people God wants to reach through it.

Day 16: More Room for the Broken

Scripture: “The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free.” - Luke 4:18

Reflection: Jesus’ ministry was focused on the broken, the poor, and the marginalized. This campaign is about creating a space where the broken can be made whole. It’s about more than a building; it’s about a movement to reach the people Jesus came for.

Prayer Focus:

Pray for the broken, the hurting, and the oppressed in our city.

Pray for our church to be a place of healing.

Pray that we would be a church known for our compassion.

Action: Find a local ministry or charity and commit to serving there after our fast is complete.

Day 17: More Room for Children

Scripture: “Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven.” - Matthew 19:14

Reflection: Children are so important to God. They are the future of our church. A new building will allow us to create a safe and engaging space for our children to learn about Jesus. Let’s remember that our campaign is not only for us but also for the next generation.

Prayer Focus:

Pray for the children in our church and community.

Pray for our children's ministry leaders and volunteers.

Pray that our new space would be a place where children can come to know Jesus.

Action: Pray over the children in your life and in our church by name.

Day 18: More Room for Prayer

Scripture: “My house will be called a house of prayer for all nations.” - Isaiah 56:7

Reflection: Prayer is the engine of our church. It is the lifeblood of our vision. A new building is not a place for us to simply gather, but a place for us to seek God and commune with Him. Let's ask God to make our church a house of prayer where people can come and encounter Him.

Prayer Focus:

Pray that prayer would be a top priority for our church.

Pray for God to raise up people to be intercessors.

Pray for a spirit of revival to break out.

Action: Find a quiet place and spend five minutes in silence, listening for God's voice.

Day 19: More Room to Worship

Scripture: “The Father is looking for those who will worship him in spirit and in truth.” - John 4:23

Reflection: God is seeking true worshipers. Our worship is not just what we do on Sundays but how we live our lives. A new building will allow us to create a space that is conducive to powerful and authentic worship. We will have more room to lift our hands, sing, and dance as we worship God in spirit and in truth.

Prayer Focus:

Pray that our church would be a place of powerful worship.

Pray for our worship leaders and musicians.

Pray that you would worship God with all of your heart, mind, and soul.

Action: Put on a worship song and spend a few minutes just praising God.

Day 20: The Celebration of Giving

Scripture: “The one who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the one who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully.” - 2 Corinthians 9:6

Reflection: As we approach the end of our fast, let’s remember that our giving is a reflection of our faith. We are not just giving money; we are sowing seeds of faith. Our giving is a celebration of what God is doing and what He will continue to do. We get to participate in a miracle.

Prayer Focus:

Pray for a heart that is ready to celebrate God's faithfulness.

Thank God for the opportunity to be a part of this campaign.

Pray that our giving would be a reflection of our love for God.

Action: Look over the pledge card and ask God to give you peace and clarity.

Day 21: Planting Our Faith

Scripture: “And a man built a house and dug deep and laid the foundation on the rock.” - Luke 6:48

Reflection: Our new building will be a planted church. It will be rooted and grounded in Christ. But before we can plant a physical building, we must plant our faith in Him. Our faith is the foundation. As we finish this fast, let’s commit to planting our lives in Him, to be a church that is rooted in His love, and to be a witness to a world in need of a Savior.

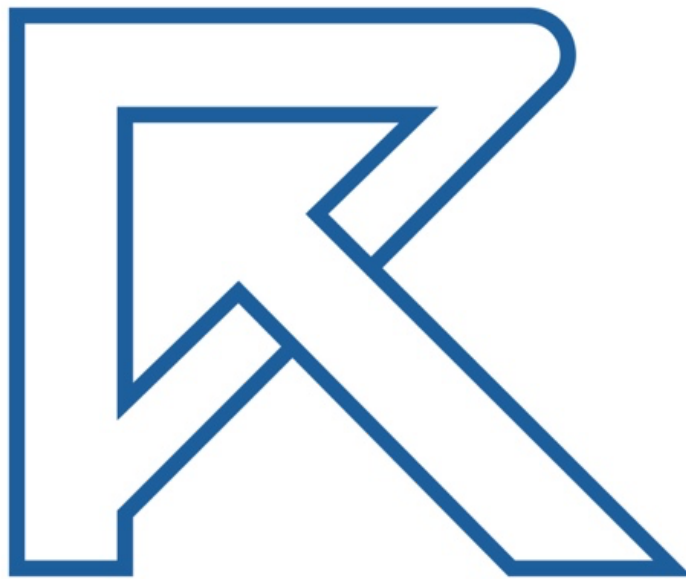
Prayer Focus:
